



AAOM/APJM Paper Develop Workshop and Mini conference Hosted by

International University of Japan

at Tokyo & Niigata, Japan February 28-March 1, 2023

Asia Academy of Management (AAOM) and Asia Pacific Journal of Management (APJM) will conduct a paper development workshop (PDW) on February 28, 2023 in Tokyo followed by a mini-conference titled *Managing Challenges in the Asia Pacific* on March 1, 2023 in Niigata at International University of Japan (IUJ), Japan.

The organizing committee consists of Li-Qun WEI (Editor-in-Chief of APJM), Yingying Zhang Zhang (Professor, Graduate School of International Management) and Maoliang BU (Senior Editor, APJM). Other panelists of PDW will include senior editors of APJM as well as other leading scholars.

The purpose of the PDW is to provide feedback to junior scholars and doctoral students on their research projects that are in advanced stage of development. Consistent with the mission of the Asia Academy of Management, our objective is to encourage scholars to do quality research on issues that are of relevance to Asia. While we certainly hope that the authors will develop their work and submit to APJM, there is no obligation to do so.

We encourage authors to submit their original work under two categories - full length papers and idea papers. Full length papers should not be more than 10,000 words in length, while proposals or paper ideas should not be more than 2500 words in length. You can submit the papers that you have previously submitted to APJM or other journals to get development feedback during the PDW. The space is limited to 20 papers.

Please make your submissions to <u>weiliqun@hkbu.edu.hk</u> by January 31st, 2023. We will make the final decisions and inform the authors by February 15, 2023.

The APJM PDW and mini—Conference is free of charge. Please note that AAOM members will receive priority to attend the PDW. The annual membership fee is HK\$700 (About US\$ 90) for academics and HK\$500 (about US\$ 65) for students. You get free electronic subscription to APJM with annual membership. Prof. Bu is also an affiliated researcher at Copenhagen Business School. Business School). He has been awarded a prestigious fellowship from the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation.

YingYing Zhang-Zhang) is a Full Professor of Management at Graduate School of International Management, International University of Japan (IUJ). She received her PhD from ESADE Business School, Ramon Llull University

in Spain. Prior to her position at IUJ, she was a faculty member at CUNEF Madrid, Spain. She has also held several visiting positions as scholar and lecturer around the world in the US, UK, Germany, Latin America and Asia, such as Harvard University, Rutgers University, Cranfield University, Gottingen University, Tec Monterrey University, and Beijing Normal University. Her research interests include strategic people management, culture, and others in the intersection between international business, strategy and people related issues such as innovation in emerging markets. Besides frequent research article publications in management journals like Journal of Business Research, International Marketing Review, International Business Review, Human Resource Management Review, International Journal of Human Resource Management, and Management and Organization; she has co-written several management books such as Leadership of Chinese Private Enterprises (Palgrave Macmillan) and The Source of Innovation in China (Palgrave Macmillan). Her works have received Emerald Research Excellence Award, and been in the finalist list of several internationally reputed awards, as well as in the Best Paper proceedings of AoM. She has been a guest editor for two special issues related to emerging markets, and is currently a board member of Women in the Academy of International Business, and Deputy Secretary-General of International Federation of Scholarly Associations of Management (IFSAM).
